Description and technical parameters of the '200th Anniversary of Education for the Blind in Hungary' collector coin

In order to promote the role of these collector coins to transfer value and educate as widely as possible, the silver version of the '200th Anniversary of Education for the Blind in Hungary' coin will be available for purchase for three months, while stock last, and the non-ferrous metal version for one year from the date of issuance of 14 October 2025 at face value at the coin shop of Magyar Pénzverő Zrt. (V. ker. Budapest, Báthory u. 7.) and in its online store (https://www.penzvero.hu/).

The **obverse of the coin** features a part of the lead glass window of the building housing the School for the Blind, a depiction of a blind girl reading, with the inscription '200 éves a vakok magyarországi oktatása' ('200th Anniversary of Education for the Blind in Hungary') repeating in the background in Braille writing. In the lower third of the obverse, bordered by a horizontal line, arranged in two lines on the left are the denominations '20,000' or '3000' and the inscription 'FORINT'. On the right, arranged in three lines, are the inscription 'MAGYARORSZÁG' ('HUNGARY'), the year of minting '2025' and the 'BP.' mint mark.

The upper half of the **reverse of the coin**, bordered by a horizontal line, features the schematic depiction of a part of the façade of the building housing the School for the Blind. In the lower half of the reverse, arranged in two lines, is the depiction '200 ÉVES A VAKOK OKTATÁSA MAGYARORSZÁGON' (200th ANNIVERSARY OF EDUCATION FOR THE BLIND IN HUNGARY'), with the inscription '1825' in Braille writing, a reference to the date of the founding of the School for the Blind. The date, in Braille writing, was sized in a way that it could be read by the blind. It is for this reason that both versions of the collector coin were made in patinated finish, which provides adequate protection for the surface of the coins. In the middle of the lower half of the obverse is designer Dorisz Mercédesz Molnár's master mark.

Non-ferrous metal collector coin

Both collector coins are 38.61 mm in diameter, their edges are reeded. The silver coin with a face value of 20,000 forints is struck in 925% fine silver and weighs 31.46 grams. The non-ferrous metal coin with a face value of 3,000 forints is produced from an alloy of copper (75%) and nickel (25%) and weighs 30.80 grams. The mintage limit of both coins is 5000 pieces in patinated finish.
