

Description and technical parameters of the “Therese Brunsvik” collector coins

In order to promote the role of these collector coins to transfer value and educate as widely as possible, the silver collector coin “Therese Brunsvik” will be available for purchase for three months, while stock last, and the non-ferrous metal version for one year from 28 July 2025 at face value, at the coin shop of Magyar Pénzverő Zrt. (Báthory u. 7., Budapest, District V) and its webshop (<https://www.penzvero.hu/>).

The **obverse of the coin** depicts a 19th-century kindergarten activity, showing a male kindergarten teacher – who exclusively fulfilled educational duties at the time – and a mixed age group of kindergarten children, typical of the period. On the left-hand edge of the obverse, in the centre, arranged in two lines, the value markings "20000" and "3000" and the inscription "FORINT" are displayed, above them, in circular lettering, the inscription "MAGYARORSZÁG" (HUNGARY), and, in the centre, at the bottom, also arranged in two lines, the year of coining "2025" and the "BP." mint mark are shown.

The **reverse of the coin** shows a half-length portrait of Therese Brunsvik, inspired by a drawing by Miklós Barabás from the year 1859. In the background, on the right, is a detail of the Brunsvik House in Mikó Street, in Buda, which gave home to the first Hungarian kindergarten, based on a 1915 painting by the artist Gergely Pörge. Above the illustration, a well-known quote by Therese Brunsvik appears in a handwriting-style font, arranged in three lines: "Education shapes the individual, and the individual shapes the nation". In the upper arc of the circle, centered, the inscription "BRUNSVIK TERÉZ" (THERESE BRUNSVIK) appears, with the years "1775 – 1861" displayed below it, indicating the year of birth and death of the founder of the kindergarten. On the reverse, at the bottom right, is the master mark of the industrial artist Andrea Horváth, designer of the collector coin.

Both collector coins have a diameter of 38.61 mm and a milled edge. The collector coin, with a face value of HUF 20,000, is struck in .925 fine silver and weighs 31.46 grams. The non-ferrous metal version with a face value of HUF 3,000 is made of an alloy of copper (75%) and nickel (25%) and weighs 30.80 grams. The mintage limit is 5,000 pieces in proof (PP) finish for the silver collector coin and 5,000 pieces in brilliant uncirculated (BU) finish for the non-ferrous version.
