

Description and technical parameters of the 'Ladislaus I of Hungary' collector coins

In order to promote the role of these collector coins to transfer value and educate as widely as possible, the silver version of the 'Ladislaus I of Hungary' coin will be available for purchase for three months, while stock last, and the non-ferrous metal version for one year from the date of issuance of 27 June 2025 at face value at the coin shop of Magyar Pénzverő Zrt. (V. ker. Budapest, Báthory u. 7.) and in its online store (<https://www.penzvero.hu/>). Detailed information about the sale of the gold collector coin can be found on the website of Magyar Pénzverő Zrt.

The **obverse of the coin** depicts the obverse of one of the silver denarii issued by Ladislaus I of Hungary. The edge of the obverse displays, in circular lettering, at the top, the inscription 'MAGYARORSZÁG' (HUNGARY), at the bottom, the value markings '500000', '20000' and '3000' and the inscription 'FORINT', horizontally, and on the left, the year of minting '2025', and on the right, the 'BP.' mint mark.

On the **reverse of the coin**, on the right, is a half-length profile of a detail of the herm of Ladislaus I of Hungary. On the left side of the reverse, arranged in three lines, is the inscription 'SZENT LÁSZLÓ KIRÁLY' (LADISLAUS I OF HUNGARY), below it, arranged in two lines, the years '1077' and '1095', indicating the period of his reign. At the bottom the master mark of the designer, goldsmith Zoltán Tóth is shown.

All three collector coins have a diameter of 34 mm with smooth edges and edge lettering. The circular legend on the smooth edges features the lettering of "UNGARORUM REX PISSIMUS LADISLAUS", meaning "Ladislaus, the very pious king of the Hungarians" (the source of the inscription is a document from 1086, which is a census of the monastery's property in Bakonybél).

The collector coin, with a face value of 500,000 forints is struck in .999 fine gold and weighs 31.104 grams (1 ounce). The collector coin, with a face value of 20,000 forints is struck in .999 fine silver and weighs 31.104 grams (1 ounce), similarly to the gold version. The non-ferrous metal coin of 3,000 forints is produced from an alloy of copper (90%) and zinc (10%) and weighs 23.40 grams. 500 and 5,000 pieces will be minted from the gold and silver collector coins in proof finish, and 5,000 pieces of the non-ferrous metal version in bronze-coated finish.
